NOTICE OF COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION PROTEST BONDING REQUIREMENT - Any person who files an action protesting a decision or intended decision pertaining to contracts administered by the Division or a State Agency pursuant to section 120.57(3)(b), Florida Statutes, shall post with the Division or State Agency, a bond payable to the Division or State Agency in an amount equal to 10% of the estimated value of the protestor's competitive solicitation response; 10% of the estimated expenditure during the contract term; \$10,000; or whichever is less. The bond shall be conditioned upon the payment of all costs which may be adjudged against the contractor filing the protest action, in the administrative hearing in which the action is brought and in any subsequent appellate court proceeding. For protest of decisions or intended decisions of the Division pertaining to agencies requests for approval of exceptional purchases, the bond shall be in the amount equal to 10% of the requesting agencies estimate of the contract amount for the exceptional purchase requested or \$10,000, whichever is less, in lieu of a bond, the Division or State Agency may, in either case, accept a cashier's check or money order in the amount of the bond. Failure of the protesting contractor to file the required bond, cashier's check or money order at the time of filing the formal protest shall result in the denial of the protest.
